MPO STP>200 K Programming Update is an addition of \$677,121.60 to Coleman Street Improvement project. This project is primarily funded through the Road Transfer program. The additional funds come from the removal of the Viking Drive Projects. The funds are to cover for change orders, claims, DOTD services and inspection (CE&I). Reduction of \$338,560.80 to each of the I-69 Frontage Road projects respectively to cover the cost of the Coleman Street Improvements.

Mr. England entertained a motion to approve the STP >200k Programming Update & Viking Drive Amendments. Dr. Wilson motioned first, and Mr. Clarke seconded. Mr. England called for questions or comments having none the chair called for a vote and the motion passed.

Call to Order

Mr. England called the meeting to order and asked Mr. Rogers to call the roll. A quorum was present.

Welcome and Introductions

Mr. Kent recognized those who have fallen and experienced great difficulties nineteen years ago around this time. A moment of silence was taken before the meeting began.

Public Comments

Mr. England called for public comments. One public comment card was turned in.

Senator Barrow Peacock wanted to speak on the I-49 update. Senator Peacock wanted to comment on a letter from Providence dated August 19, 2020 to Congressman Mike Johnson in regard to I-49. He noticed that within the second paragraph it states that "our team received a notice to proceed on the final portion of the project on July 8, 2020". Money for this project was passed in legislature in 2019. It looks like a year was lost due to this time lag. Senator Peacock suggests that any future problems should be communicated throughout as quickly as possible.

Mr. Rogers stated that the notice to proceed was on the final portions of the scope that we had been working through for roughly a year. Providence was still under contract working on the previous scope of services in place. That new notice to proceed was on the additional scope of services. Mr. Rogers states that Providence was provided a limited notice to proceed on the additional scope of services prior to that. Providence has undergone some drastic changes within their organization. Earth Search is no longer doing the cultural work. Coastal Environmental is now doing the cultural work. DOTD has also appointed a new project manager. Mr. Rogers states that he has full confidence that this project will move forward as fast as it can get done.

Business

1. Approval of Minutes

Project Updates

4. I-49 Inner City Connector

Mr. Rogers invited Mrs. Kerry Oriol to speak on this project. Mrs. Oriol mentions that they have had significant changes within the office. She has been with this project from when it began in 2008. One the things that they are focusing on is keeping everyone aware of the current schedule. The schedule will be updated monthly. The last status update was in February 2020. Since that time, a supplement was granted to allow the project to be completed in accord with current standards and environmental regulations.

1. Cultural Resources Survey

Completed: Revised CRS submitted to DOTD for SHPO second review in November 2019.

Currently: No response relative to this second submittal has been received. However, Section 106 Consultation is scheduled to begin in October and additional ROW review is underway. We are awaiting a meeting with DOTD relative to confirming field survey areas, once we have approval, field surveying in the Allendale area will commence, to be followed later in the LA 3132 right-of-way.

- 2. Finalize conceptual interchange layouts with potential impacts
- Completed: Comments on geometric drawings in June 2019 were received and responses provided.
- Currently: Providence is awaiting confirmation from DOTD that there are no further comments before re-submitting the geometry.
- 3. Finalize and submit an Alternatives Analysis for FHWA and DOTD review
- Completed: A new Alternatives Analysis was submitted to DOTD for review and comment in accordance with the current schedule on September 4, 2020.
- Currently: Review of the Alternatives Analysis is underway.
- 4. Acceptance of the Alternative Analysis by FHWA and DOTD (required to complete the draft EIS)

Currently: See #3

- 5. Prepare Technical Studies required to be conducted on the Identified Preferred Alternative and to be summarized in the draft EIS.
- Comments: To be completed upon approval of Identified Preferred Alternative includes line and grade/geometry. The only action relative to this item is the cultural resources surveying.

- 6. Public Outreach in the form of stakeholder briefings, a Citizen's Advisory Committee Meeting, and a public hearing will be conducted in conjunction with the release of the draft EIS.
- Comments: To be imitated after draft EIS has been reviewed, revised and cleared for distribution.

5. Metropolitan Transportation Plan

Mr. Rogers states that Alliance Transportation group is the group working on this project. Meetings have been scheduled with each of the members of the board. If a meeting has not been scheduled or has been postponed it needs to be set up. Mr. Rogers asks the board to help push out the website including a survey and comments for the general public. This project is moving along quite well and on schedule.

4. I-49 Inner City Connector

Mr. Rogers introduced the status report and project update for the I-49 Inner City Connector. The status report and project update is as follows:

1. Cultural Resources Survey

Required: A revised CRS with an addendum summarizing the new survey data will be submitted to the SHPO for approval.

Currently: Field survey of additional historic structures in the vicinity of Build Alternatives 1 and 2 as requested by the SHPO was initiated on October 5th. Approval from the DOTD and SHPO was obtained on the survey area for Build Alternative 5 on October 16th. Surveying of Build Alternative 5 will not occur until after all survey and reporting is completed for Build Alternatives 1 and 2.

2. Finalize conceptual interchange layouts with potential impacts

Completed: Providence resubmitted Build Alternative 1 geometry with comments addressed from October 2019.

Currently: Providence received comments that additional detail would be required to complete DOTD's review. The additional data is relative details that are part of the line and grade that is to be conducted later in the schedule. To facilitate the review, Providence is developing this detail ahead of schedule, with revisions to be provided by October 23rd.

3. Finalize and submit an Alternatives Analysis for FHWA and DOTD review

Completed: A new Alternatives Analysis was submitted to DOTD for review and comment in accordance with the current schedule on September 4, 2020.

Currently: Comments from DOTD on the Alternatives document were received and addressed. Additional comments relative to the cost estimate in the appendix were received, these are being addressed and will be provided back to DOTD by October 20th.

4. Acceptance of the Alternative Analysis by FHWA and DOTD (required to complete the draft EIS) and the Preparation of Technical Studies

These require acceptance of #3 above.

5. Public Outreach in the form of stakeholder briefings, a Citizen's Advisory Committee Meeting, and a public hearing will be conducted in conjunction with the release of the draft EIS

Currently: A media release was provided to inform the public that the project continues forward. The CAC members are being contacted to ensure continued commitment to serve and additional potential members are being invited.

2. Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) Update

Mr. Rogers introduced the following TIP updates:

- 1. H.014059 US 80 Bridges Near Minden: Request is to move the Engineering Phase of the project from FFY 2020 to FFY 2022. This modification in Engineering Phase FFY causes an amendment to the construction phase as reflected below in the Amendments being introduced for public comments.
- 2. L.000083 CONVERSION OF AC (INCLUDES DEBT SERVICE): Conversion of Advance Construction funding to Federal Funding (STP>200K, STPFlex and NHPP). This action allows for LADOTD to formally request the conversion of advance construction funds to Federal program funds. This includes funds for the I-20/I-220 Barksdale Gate Access Road project as prescribed in the GARVEE bonds agreement between LADOTD and FHWA. Although this is a programmatic operation due to the % increase the amendment is subject to public comment.
- 3. Introduction for Public Comment: H.014059 US 80 Bridges Near Minden-Remove Construction Phase in FFY 2021

H.10468 I-20: West End Hudson St. Bridge to I-49-Move Construction phase from FFY 2022 to FFY 2023

H.014059 amendment is reflective of the Administrative Modifications noted above. These actions will remove the projects from the current TIP which runs through FFY 2022.

4. TIP MPO STP>200 K Programing Update: Public Comment Period on Linwood Ave Phase 3 and 4 10.23.2020 – 11.22.2020. No Public Comments Received.

Project Updates

3. I-49 Inner City Connector

Mr. Rogers introduced the status report and project update for the I-49 Inner City Connector. The status report and project update is as follows:

General Status-

The project will be off schedule by approximately four months resulting from FHWA direction provided in November 2020. Please see below for details.

• Cultural Resources Survey

Required: A revised CRS with an addendum summarizing the new survey data will be submitted to the SHPO for approval.

Currently: All field survey for cultural resources has been completed (BA 1, BA 2, and BA 5). Coastal Environments is preparing the necessary documents (structure forms) and curating artifacts as part of the addendum to be prepared. The addendum to the CRS is anticipated to be submitted in late January 2021.

• Finalize conceptual interchange layouts with potential impacts

Completed: Providence resubmitted Build Alternative 1 geometry with comments addressed from October 2019.

Currently: DOTD has requested more data that is part of the line and grade task. Providence is working to provide this data and anticipates submitting it in January 2021.

• Finalize and submit an Alternatives Analysis for FHWA and DOTD review

Completed: A new Alternatives Analysis was submitted to DOTD for review and comment in accordance with the current schedule on September 4, 2020.

Currently: As of November, FHWA indicated that they will not be reviewing this document. They have requested that only draft chapters of the EIS be provided for review and that alternatives analysis be held as incomplete until after the Section 106 process has been completed, or at least comments have been provided by the SHPO. This is not in accord with previous comments from 2019, whereby the interim alternatives analysis was requested to be resubmitted with additional detail on BA 5, including updated and realistic cost data for all the alternatives. FHWA agreed to review a draft table of contents for the draft EIS and is in internal discussion to provide direction to the project team on what is acceptable for us to work on while awaiting the conclusion of the Section 106 process.

• Acceptance of the Alternative Analysis by FHWA and DOTD (required to complete the draft EIS) and the Preparation of Technical Studies

These require acceptance of #3 above.

Note that the Section 106 process will be followed by a Section 4(f) evaluation. With the SHPO's comments relative to the creation of a new historic district, it is possible that none of the current build alternatives will avoid Section 4(f) resources. DOTD has approved Providence to develop a build alternative that avoids Section 4(f) resources, as is required by the FHWA Section 4(f) policy

paper. This requires a previously eliminated alternative that avoided such resources to be further developed. Development of this alternative will not affect the project schedule as revised.

• Public Outreach in the form of stakeholder briefings, a Citizen's Advisory Committee Meeting, and a public hearing will be conducted in conjunction with the release of the draft EIS

Currently: A media release was provided to inform the public that the project continues forward. The CAC members (new and old) met via Zoom on October 29, 2020, where the project team provided an update the project and discussed the roll and responsibilities of the CAC. The next meeting is anticipated to be scheduled in February 2021.

4. Metropolitan Transportation Plan

Mr. Rogers introduced the status report and project update for the Metropolitan Transportation Plan. The status report and project update is as follows:

• Task 1 Project Schedule, Work Plan, Committee Activity

ATG staff conducted routine project administrative activities including accounting, invoicing, and tracking as well as conducting project coordination meetings with the NLCOG project manager and deputy project manager. The project team has developed presentation materials and one-page updates for communication and coordination with the Policy and Advisory Committees.

• Task 2 Public Involvement

ATG staff created and launched the online visioning tool (https://nlcog-mtp-2045atginc.hub.arcgis.com/), including a survey and comment map. The ATG team also developed additional outreach and advertisement materials. Over 50 comments have been received through the online tool with the highest frequency of comments relating to Supporting Land Use and Economic Development Goals, Improving Safety & Security, and Improving Infrastructure Condition & System Preservation. The project team has also been conducting ongoing one-on-one and group stakeholder interviews and has been working closely with NLCOG staff on the coordination of stakeholders for a mini-Delphi process. Delphi meetings are in progress.

• Task 3 Develop review of Guiding Principles, Goals, Objectives, and Performance Measures ATG team worked with NLCOG staff in review and discussions of goals, objectives, and performance measures in the project process and project selection methodology. This included the incorporation of initial analysis data into the Performance Measures framework. This process also included considerations for including and continuing the goals and objectives identified in a review of state, regional, and local plans relating to transportation, land use, and economic growth.

• Task 4 Existing Conditions Review and Base Model Update

The project team worked with a number of data sets and resources to develop model inputs to include a base year and control totals update as well as an update of external stations, added network, and added traffic analysis zones for the expanded model footprint. The base year development and control totals were presented for review through the mini-Delphi process. The NLCOG TDM Network and TAZ layers are nearly complete with the addition of Webster Parish, capacity-relevant TIP projects, and updated attribute information such as intersections and traffic counts. The ATG team is currently updating the transit route system coded onto the roadway

network using the GTFS data provided by NLCOG and is including trips for external stations, including the new stations of Webster Parish, which were completed using StreetLight Origin-Destination Data.

Other major accomplishments include modifications to model scripts to convert the model to TransCAD 8.0 from the previous version of TransCAD 6.0. The conversion of the model was successfully tested with positive results. Demographics are being estimated concurrently with the Delphi meetings with key stakeholders that are occurring over the next few weeks. Once demographics have been developed, the team will begin calibration and validation of the updated NLCOG TDM.

• Task 5 Transportation System Needs and Scenarios (2045)

Though Task 5 will begin full implementation once the project call has concluded and proposed projects can be entered for evaluation, an initial review of the transit component of TDM scenario files has been conducted which includes coordination on GTFS feed for transit layer mentioned in the Task 4 summary.

• Task 6 Safety Element

The project team has concluded the initial safety data analysis and memorandum and has identified key trends related to vulnerable users, crash types, top contributing factors, crash hot spots, and freight related crashes. Recommendations were made based on trends that also align with goals/performance targets of the state and the MPO and have included the emphasis areas and projects identified by the Regional Safety Coalition. The ATG team has worked in coordination with the Regional Safety Coordinator and has attended several virtual Coalition meetings.

• Task 7: Transit Element

The project team has concluded the initial existing transit conditions analysis and memorandum and identified areas of potential high likelihood for transit demand, including possible recommendations for future improvement of services, and has met in coordination with the regional Coordinated Human Services Transportation Committee to gather additional stakeholder input.

• Task 8: Review Existing Freight Network and Services

The project team has concluded the initial freight conditions analysis and memorandum and has identified mobility restrictions/gaps in service along freight corridors including congestion, lack of connectivity, shortage of truck parking, lack of intermodal centers, and issues with institutional function/oversight.

• Task 9: Review Existing Bike/Pedestrian Facilities

The project team has concluded the initial existing bike and pedestrian conditions analysis and memorandum. The analysis included an inventory of current conditions, facility adequacy, and spatial representation as well as an identification of gaps in service related to safety, design, and connectivity, and provided initial recommendations based on these gaps.

• Task 10 Financial & Staged Improvement Plan

The project team has concluded the initial Revenue Forecasts analysis and memorandum. The memorandum is going through the QA/QC process. It includes an analysis of historical trends for both roadway and transit. Preliminary forecasts were created based on historical trends.

• Task 11 Assessment of Environmental Impacts of the Staged Improvement Plan The project team has partially delivered the Systems Level Analysis and memorandum, including key demographics, environmental features, and historical and cultural resources. Once the project call process has concluded on December 18, the project team will identify projects that may have potential environmental impacts and put them through a buffer analysis to spatially identify where those impacts will be.

• Task 12 MTP Preparation

The project team has developed plan branding and draft plan template files with logos and color style guides. The team has also developed a federal compliance checklist based on the Federal Rules and Executive Orders concerning Metropolitan Planning. This will be used in the development of the final plan document and will be provided in support of compliance review for subsequent FHWA and DOTD consideration.

6. LA 511 – Jimmie Davis Bridge

Mr. Rogers introduced the status report and project update for the LA 511 – Jimmie Davis Bridge. The status report and project update is as follows:

Current Status

Stage 1 Environmental Analysis (EA) has been completed. However, a revision was deemed necessary and submissions were made in 2019. This EA reviewed two basic options: (1) construction of a new modern 4-lane bridge (2) total rehabilitation of the existing 2-lane bridge and construction of a new 2-lane sister span. State Senator Peacock has championed this project through the capital outlay process securing funds towards this effort. Total Cost for the bridge is in the range of \$80 -\$100 Million.

The project manager is working to get the plans updated in order to possibly let the rehabilitation project sometime next year (plans updated from the previous project to rehab a few years ago). The draft of the revisions to the EA by DOTD have been submitted to FHWA. DOTD is currently waiting on a decision from FHWA on whether they will accept the submittal as a reevaluation of the 2015 EA or whether they will require DOTD to submit a supplemental EA to finish the process for the capacity project. Two alternatives are still being evaluated: rehab existing facility and a new two-lane ban, or one new four lane span.

7. Governors Climate Initiative

Mr. Rogers introduced the Climate Initiatives Task Force. They are charged to develop and evaluate emissions reduction proposals and create implementation strategies to reach short, medium, and long-term greenhouse gas emission reduction goals. They have an emissions reduction goal of 26-28% by 2025, 40-50% by 2030 and Net Zero by 2050. The Climate Initiatives Task Force is broken down into four advisory groups and six sector committees. The advisory groups are as follows: Scientific, Equity, Finance and Legal. The sector committees are as follows: Agriculture, Forestry, Conservation and Waste; Power Production, Distribution and Use; Land Use, Buildings, and Housing; Manufacturing and Industry; Transportation; Mining and Oil & Gas Production. The Transportation Committee is charged to examine opportunities to lower greenhouse gas emissions from highway and non-highway mobile emission sources. Opportunities to promote alternative and renewable fuels, idle-reduction measures, fuel economy improvements, new transportation technology, and cleaner modes of transportation will all be considered.

1. Cultural Resources Survey and Section 106 Process

Required: A revised CRS with an addendum summarizing the new survey data has been submitted to DOTD for review, after which it will be submitted to FHWA and the SHPO for review and comment.

A second Consulting Party meeting will be required during/after the SHPO review as part of the Section 106 process.

Currently: The revised CRS was submitted to DOTD in January 2021, the complete CRS addendum was submitted in late February, with some edits the first week of March 2021. During the Agency Team Project Status meeting held April 22, 2021, DOTD advised that comments would be forthcoming in mid-May, as of May 18, 2021, Providence has yet to receive these comments. A second Consulting Parties meeting for the Section 106 process will be scheduled either during or after the SHPO's review of the revised CRS and addendum, which will confirm culture resources anticipated to be adversely affected. SHPO review of the documents will not occur until after FHWA review, which has not begun.

2. Finalize conceptual interchange layouts with potential impacts

- Completed: Providence resubmitted Build Alternative 1 geometry with comments addressed from October 2019.
- Currently: Providence submitted revised geometry in January 2021. DOTD review of this material was completed, and additional comments provided on April 30, 2021 relative to both geometry and traffic. Revisions associated with the comments are on hold until the Section 106 process has further progressed.

3. Bridge concepts

- Required: Bridge structure types and layout are required as part of the line and grade, additionally, the project calls for the consideration of aesthetic designs/concepts for the urban section of elevated highway.
- Currently: Due to the progress on this work that had occurred prior to the stoppage of work for the Section 106 process, this work was completed in draft form and presented internally to the DOTD for comments. Comments were received, revisions associated with the comments are on hold until the Section 106 process has further progressed

4. Prepare draft sections of the EIS for DOTD and FHWA Review

Currently: Providence developed an avoidance alternative that will be required for the EIS (and was referenced in the December 2020 update). This alternative will not be fully considered until after SHPO review of the revised CRS and addendum. Providence has updated as much detail in the previously drafted chapters of the EIS as can be done while awaiting the outcome of the Section 106 process.

5. Review and concurrence with the draft Alternatives Chapter of the draft EIS by FHWA and DOTD (required to complete the draft EIS) and the Preparation of Technical Studies

These require completion of the Section 106 process and submittal, review, and agreement on the draft Alternatives chapter under Items 3 and 4 above.

- 6. Public Outreach in the form of stakeholder briefings, a Citizen's Advisory Committee (CAC) Meeting, and a public hearing will be conducted in conjunction with the release of the draft EIS
 - Currently: We should be unveiling an upgraded project website in May 2021. No stakeholder briefings or the next CAC meeting will be scheduled until the Section 106 process is further progressed.

Other Items of Note:

A Project Status Update Meeting was held on April 22, 2021. These meetings involve multiple staff from the lead and decision-making agencies (NLCOG, FHWA, DOTD) and the consultant team (Providence, Stantec, Franklin, Coastal). The primary focus of this meeting was to discuss the status of the culture studies review and the impact of the Section 106 process on the overall schedule. The project website refresh, bridge structure aesthetics, and Context Sensitive Solutions were also discussed, along with any schedule items that could be worked while awaiting the conclusion of the Section 106 process.

These discussions did yield direction from FHWA that any work for the project that is in development through the contract with Providence and the environmental process that has not been reviewed and approved by DOTD with concurrence of FHWA is not to be shared in a public setting at this time and would be done so with the issuance of the Draft EIS. This guidance limits the materials that can be uploaded to the website as well as that which can be shared with interested parties to only those items/deliverables that are final and/or approved.

2. Finalize conceptual interchange layouts with potential impacts

- Completed: Providence resubmitted Build Alternative 1 geometry with comments addressed from October 2019.
- Currently: No Change Since May Update Providence submitted revised geometry in January 2021. DOTD review of this material was completed, and additional

comments provided on April 30, 2021 relative to both geometry and traffic. Revisions associated with the comments are on hold until the Section 106 process has further progressed

3. Bridge concepts

Required: Bridge structure types and layout are required as part of the line and grade, additionally, the project calls for the consideration of aesthetic designs/concepts for the urban section of elevated highway.

Currently: No Change Since May Update – Due to the progress on this work that had occurred prior to the stoppage of work for the Section 106 process, this work was completed in draft form and presented internally to the DOTD for comments. Comments were received, revisions associated with the comments are on hold until the Section 106 process has further progressed

4. Prepare draft sections of the EIS for DOTD and FHWA Review

Currently: No Change Since May Update – Providence has updated as much detail in the previously drafted chapters of the EIS as can be done while awaiting the outcome of the Section 106 process.

5. Review and concurrence with the draft Alternatives Chapter of the draft EIS by FHWA and DOTD (required to complete the draft EIS) and the Preparation of Technical Studies

These require completion of the Section 106 process and submittal, review, and agreement on the draft Alternatives chapter under Items 3 and 4 above.

6. Public Outreach in the form of stakeholder briefings, a Citizen's Advisory Committee (CAC) Meeting, and a public hearing will be conducted in conjunction with the release of the draft EIS

Currently: Refreshed project website is up and running. No stakeholder briefings or the next CAC meeting will be scheduled until the Section 106 process is further progressed.

Other Items of Note:

The third Project Progress Meeting was held on June 17, 2021. These meetings involve multiple staff from the lead and decision-making agencies (NLCOG, FHWA, DOTD) and the consultant team (Providence, Stantec, Franklin, Coastal). This meeting basically discussed the CRS Addendum review status and schedule and a quick run through of the refreshed website (www.i49shreveport.com).

6. LA 511 – Jimmie Davis Bridge

Mr. Rogers introduced the status report and project update for the LA 511 – Jimmie Davis Bridge. The status report and project update is as follows:

Project Details

The Louisiana Highway 511 (LA 511) Jimmie Davis Bridge over the Red River connects the high growth areas of south Bossier City and South Shreveport. LA 511 is a 5-lane facility on both sides of the river and connects to the Arthur Ray Teague Parkway in Bossier and the Clyde Fant Parkway in Caddo, each providing high capacity north-south movements to the downtown – riverfront areas.

Update

Additional \$100 million provided in the legislative session that ended Thursday June 10, 2021

The Joint Transportation Committee approved the use of Design – Build for the project.

The Louisiana Transportation Authority refunded the application fee to an Unsolicited Proposal for a Jimmie Davis Bridge Toll Project.

7. LA 3132 – Inner Loop Extension

Mr. Rogers introduced the status report and project update for the LA 3132 – Inner Loop Extension. The status report and project update is as follows:
